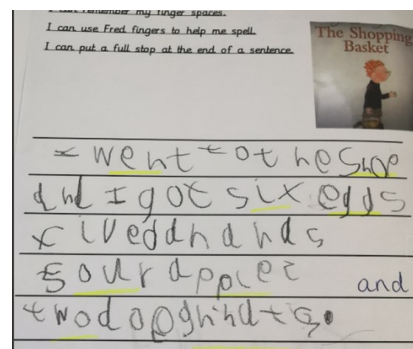
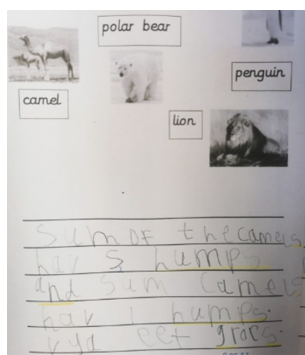
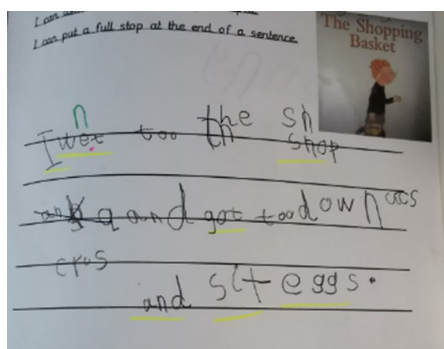
In memory of Nuel-Junior

Year 5 identified areas of kitchen safety, hygiene requirements and safe food preparation.

They then created their salads and finally, they tasted and evaluated the seasonal salads, comments included:

'Delicious, crunchy and tasty'

'Would taste better with more mayonnaise and less yoghurt!'

'Smelt fresh like Mango, but a little too much cabbage!'

The Year 6 SATs results this year were the highest we have ever had at Chilton. We are very proud of the children and the hard work and effort they have put in. Thank you also to the staff and parents/carers because the great results are due to years of hard work and support for the children. The combined score for children meeting the expected standard for Reading, Writing and Maths was 56%, this is in line with the National Average for 2022. It's great to see the hard work from everyone is starting to show.

The local Police have recently had reports with regards to young people accessing private land that has lakes or sections of rivers running through it to use the water to swim/play in hot weather.
